 THE SOUTHERNS ABROAD

We are pleased to chronicle another victory for the above club. A dispatch received in this city last night states that they beat the Atlantic Base Ball Club, of St. Louis, on Sunday, beating them in a full game ten to four; and that it must have been a splendid game is shown by the fact that it was played in one hour and five minutes, which we believe is about the quickest time on record. The Southernns were to play the Empire Club, of St. Louis city, to-day. We presume that the party in Memphis who telegraphed that the Southern Club left that city by boat on Saturday morning must have been in error, for in that event they could not have arrived at St. Louis in time to play on Sunday.

The following is the score of the game played in Memphis on Friday against the Bluff City Club. The game was called at 3:30 P.M. in the presence of quite a large concourse of people, among whom were quite a number of ladies.
