PROGRAMME:

Grand Match Game of Base Ball between the Southern Junior and Lone Star Junior Clubs, for the Championship Junior Flag.

Game to commence at 9 o'clock, A.M.

Grand Match Game of Base Ball between the Second Nines of the R. E. Lees and Washington Clubs, for the Championship Second Nine Flag.

Game to commence at 12 o'clock M.

Grand match game of base ball between the SOUTHERN NINE and a PICKED NINE. Prize – Nine gold medals. A medal to be awarded to the best man in his position, as shown by a complete score.

Foot race of 100 yards, open to all members of the Louisiana State Base Ball Association. Prize – Silver medal “Champion”

Foot race of 300 yards, open to all members of the Louisiana State Base Ball Association. Prize – Silver medal “Champion”

Foot race of 500 yards, open to all members of the Louisiana State Base Ball Association. Prize – “The Game of Silver Chimes” offered by P.F. Gogarty, Esq.

Throwing match, open to all members of Louisiana State Base Ball Association. Prize – Silver medal “Champion”

Hand Engine Race, by hand, quarter mile. Thirty men to go to work and force water through fifty feet of hose in the quickest time, all to use the same engine. Open for the Fire Departments of Jefferson City, Carrollton, Algiers and Gretna. Prize – Silver Cooler and Cup.

Grand Hand Engine Race, by hand, quarter mile. Thirty men to go to work and force water through fifty feet of hose in the quickest time, all to use the same engine. Open to the City Fire Department. Prize – A beautiful Silver Water Cooler and three Goblets.

Grand Hand Engine Race, against time, one half mile, by Brad Ferry No. 12 and Columbia No. 5, under rules governing former races.

After 6 o'clock P.M. the Dancing Platform will be exclusively for persons wishing to dance.

Admission fifty cents. Ladies and children free.
