Base-Ball Game of the Mutuals at New Orleans

The Mutuals, of New York, having deferred their departure, arranged a game with the champion R.E. Lees, which came off at the Park, yesterday, in the presence of an audience which was select if not numerous. The contest was the very best of the Mutual series in this city, and eclipsed the famous game of the Stars played last Sunday. To the close of the eighth inning the score was small and the game evenly contested, the total figures at that point being 8 to 8, and decidedly interesting. In the ninth inning, however, the New-Yorkers rallied to the tune of seven runs, and putting the Lees out for a blank, scored the victory. The following is the score:
