Larry Gilbert's Debut

May 7, 1917

Having just been acquired from Kansas City in the American Association, native New Orleanian Larry Gilbert donned a New Orleans Pelican uniform for the first time against the Little Rock Travelers on May 6, 1917. In the fourth inning, in only his second at-bat of the game, Gilbert stroked a two-run triple to right field off Rube Robinson. He also had a good day in the field, tallying four putouts including a sensational one-handed catch while running down a hard line drive off Manning.
